ABOUT THE ARTISTS

DJ Savarese (Producer and Subject)

Savarese graduated with highest honors from Grinnell High School in Iowa. Currently in his final year at Oberlin College, he majors in anthropology and creative writing and holds a 3.9 GPA. He is the institution's first nonspeaking student with autism and the first anywhere to live in the dorms (with an aide). The recipient of numerous scholarships, including a Herbert Hoover Uncommon Student Award and an ASAN Autistic Scholars Fellowship, he has presented at conferences across the country. His prose and poetry have been published in *Disability Studies Quarterly*, Stone Canoe, Wordgathering, Voices for Diversity and Social Justice and Seneca Review.

Robert Rooy (Producer and Director)

Rooy has worked as an independent filmmaker in more than twenty countries creating media with and for international anti-poverty, human rights and environmental organizations. He is the producer/director of *To Our Credit*, an in-depth PBS documentary series that explores microfinance as an anti-poverty strategy. Rooy has also been an assistant director on more than forty films, including *Lonesome Dove, Honeymoon in Vegas, Minority Report* and *The West Wing*. He holds an MFA degree from Yale School of Drama, a Distinguished Alumnus Award from Calvin College and a National MediaMaker Fellowship from the Bay Area Video Coalition.
